SCASC RCM Report
January 10, 2021

Yesterday I attended the Regional Service Committee meeting via ZOOM. Quite a bit of business was conducted. All of the officers' reports and subcommittees' reports are on our regional website, crna.org. To access these reports, as well as the minutes of the meeting: log in to crna.org, select "For Members", scroll down to and select "Service Resources". At the bottom of that page, open the link (in a blue text box) that says, "Secure Document Portal". The password for that page is "crsc_password". On that page one can access the above referenced material, as well as many other regional documents, various service guidelines, information about how to participate in on-going NA projects and service related bulletins.

The Regional Delegate reported information about a NAWS lawsuit. This information is covered, in detail, in the NAWS News, available at na.org. The World Convention Narcotics Anonymous slated for Sydney, Australia will not happen in 2021. Efforts are being made to shift this to 2022. The RD reported that there are some highly informative, new videos about NA services that can be found at <https://www.na.org/media>.

The regional PR chair reported that there will be a Phoneline Volunteer Orientation Sat., Feb. 13 at 2:00pm. This will be a ZOOM meeting. The login information will be posted on the calendar at crna.org. At the area PR chair's request, I asked if an addition could be added to the phoneline greeting: "If this is a medical emergency, please hang up and call 911". This was well received and will be happening.

Although there is not a regional H&I chair, the coordinator for the Carolina Region's "Sponsorship Behind the Walls" task force did submit an extensive report about sponsoring people in prison as well as proposed guidelines for that workgroup. I will include his report, minus the proposed guidelines, with my report. This workgroup provides an invaluable service to inmates trying to stay clean behind bars and transitioning back into society. There are more inmates seeking help than volunteers.

There will be a virtual orientation for the YAP platform available for all to attend January 17, 2021, immediately following the subcommittee meeting. A step-by-step PDF guide to using the YAP platform will also be available via email. All areas that have not attended this subcommittee or an orientation are encouraged to attend. The meeting information will be on the calendar at crna.org.

There is a financial situation involving a former Regional Delegate: she was given \$1800.00 to attend the most recent World Service Conference, which was canceled, and then she subsequently resigned. The treasurer reported that, as of yet, this money has not been returned. It was reported that the former Regional Delegate has cancer and is in hospice care. Even if this were not the case, it would cost more to take her to court than what she owes. We should expect a regional motion to "write off" this debt.

The regional treasurer recommended that the region send a donation of \$7885.00 to NAWS. This was adopted by the RCM's. The treasurer also reported that the region's liability insurance carrier does not provide liability coverage for any legal actions associated with the current pandemic. I encourage all homegroups that are having in-person meetings to strictly follow the NAWS guidelines such meetings. Not doing so will expose meeting attendees to life-threatening illness and NA, as a whole, to detrimental harm. The pandemic is the worst it has been since it started.

Sponsorship Behind the Walls Project Report 12/04/2020
Reported by Taggart Fitzgerald

We are an NA step writing sponsorship project operating under the Hospitals and Institutions Subcommittee of the Carolina Region of Narcotics Anonymous. The primary purpose of this project is to provide Sponsorship, through written Narcotics Anonymous step guidance, for any incarcerated addict desiring recovery within Narcotics Anonymous. It is our purpose to provide sponsors who are willing to correspond with any inmate who has the desire to work the Steps. Our sponsors are required to use pen names and to remain anonymous. It is our hope, that in our correspondence we will help the suffering addict find the solution that we have found. We operate under existing state and federal Correctional Facilities rules regarding mail and correspondence and have required no special permission from individual facilities. Our service is for and to the incarcerated addict seeking recovery. When an incarcerated addict writes us, we send out a letter explaining the program and requesting release information, etc. The recovering addict seeking a sponsor from us is then asked to write sequential essays on three IP's. Am I an Addict, Welcome to Narcotics Anonymous, and Sponsorship. Once we receive the third essay, we assign them a sponsor. All correspondence passes through the CRSBTW mailbox in Charleston, SC or CRSBTW@GMAIL.COM. Once a sponsor is assigned, we no longer read the letters except to confirm scans. We scan, forward, print, and/or mail the correspondence.

We currently have 4 NA volunteers manning the program. There is a Port City NA member in Charleston who picks up the mail and scans it to our GMAIL address and a Google drive folder. He has two backup volunteers, but they haven't had to pick up mail for a while. Then we have another NA member (currently me) who forwards scanned letters to sponsors, prints out and mails scanned letters from sponsors, responds to essay letters and requests with form letters or modified form letters, updates the spreadsheet and drive folders, and performs the phone orientations. Normally that process takes 2-3 hours a week. With the covid reduction in received mail, that has been less. We do not currently have a trained backup. The sponsors participating in this workgroup are primarily in the Carolinas but we have sponsors in four other states. By policy, this service is accountable to the CRNA H&I Mobile Unit Chair who is accountable to the H&I chair, but at this time both of those positions are vacant. With the vacancy of the CRNA Vice Chair, our accountability is currently assumed to be to the H&I

subcommittee and to the CRNA chair. Without any elected H&I trusted servants, I currently communicate directly to the CRNA Chair,

We receive about 8 letters a week, but we have had spikes of 15 or more. We have been running a bit less through the pandemic period, but letters have recently picked up to pre pandemic levels. We had 14 last week.

Our updated stats follow Dec 1st – March 1st:

Our PO Box was paid up for another year in August. With what has been so far our normal rate, we are going through around 90 stamps, 450 sheets of paper, and 75 envelopes a quarter. It was less this quarter. Ink seems to be more like once every 6-8 months or so, but that could change with additional support and a second printer/scanner becomes active. As far as literature expenses go, we encourage incarcerated addicts seeking sponsorship to write NAWS to request a Basic Text. NAWS will send an incarcerated addict a Basic Text, but they usually have to write them twice. We explain this also in our welcome letter. We have had a lot of activity from Texas prisons. For those, we also send out a flyer for the Bluebonnet region's Basic text for inmates program. Unless we get requests through the sponsorship program for literature support for a Behind the Walls NA group, we don't put in any lit requests to the subcommittee until we assign sponsors. We let the sponsor find out what literature their sponsee has access to and after we know that and what the sponsor wants them to have to work with, we put in the request. We currently have a Behind the Walls group in SC requesting literature and a couple of sponsor lit requests. We have agreed to only make these requests once a month.

Last year around this time the volunteers and myself started working on some changes to our guidelines and submitted a draft for approval, but with the unfilled subcommittee positions and lack of formal subcommittee meetings during the pandemic, to my knowledge, nothing has happened with these proposed changes. For some background on why the changes were needed, when the subcommittee originally formulated our current guidelines, we copied, pasted, and wrote them to the best of our ability in the subcommittee, but we really had no experience and some of what we found and used from other sbtw programs, I don't believe had been truly tested by experience either. We tried to protect against real and unreal possibilities and probably took ourselves a little too seriously and overdid it a bit. In my opinion, and the subsequent conscience of the workgroup volunteers, the use of pen names and the PO box eliminates almost all of the issues we were trying to address. The first item that became evident to myself and Janine while doing orientations was the requirement of an area H&I chair or RCM endorsement. This just never felt right, and the two of us had basically just stopped doing it. Any other service of this level has a clean time requirement and an orientation to the guidelines. The new wording we came up with through our email/consensus process is now laid out in the first paragraph of the draft guidelines and all of the signature lines etc on the Sponsor information form have been removed.

The other major change is to the anonymity requirements upon release. We had originally discussed a Bridging the Gap program to deal with transitions while creating the program, but decided to get the SBTW off the ground first. Well, we have now had our first incarcerated recovering addict using this sponsorship program to be released, and the discussions with that sponsor expedited these discussions and proposed changes. The consensus of the volunteers was that upon release, when this program ends, the decision as to whether a sponsor chooses to break their pen name anonymity on some level and continue their relationship is really between the sponsor and sponsee. Concerning this, we added a 90 day Bridging the Gap option where letters between sponsor and sponsee may be forwarded for 90 days through the CRSBTW mailbox, removed the wording that had stated that a sponsor could be removed from the program for breaking their anonymity or contacting their sponsee after release, and added a line stating that during the prerelease period the sponsee could provide the sponsor with a forwarding address if that is the transition plan they both choose. What happens upon release isn't discussed in any SBTW correspondence during the essay process, so no expectation should have been set for this. The providing of literature information was cleaned up, and most of the other changes have to do with making the guidelines mirror the information given out during the orientations. I did most of the original rewrite and then sent the draft out to the volunteers. After a couple of rounds of feedback and rewrites, the attached draft policy is our result. I am glad to answer any questions about reasoning, intent, process, etc., and my emails to Dave with the draft attachment in early 2020 offer some explanation as well.

With this report, I intend to provide a request flyer with contact information for any incarcerated addicts your area H&I subcommittees may know of who would benefit from this service. Per policy, we will do our best to provide anonymous sponsorship by mail to incarcerated addicts that request it. If the incarcerated addict has less than 90days remaining in their facility, we will do our best to provide them with a meeting schedule and contact information for NA in the area where they will be released. I also intend to provide a flyer for volunteers to help with sponsorship. We are not in a dire situation, as some of our sponsors can double up and all of our sponsors aren't tasked as of yet, but it's evident from the number of incarcerated addicts active in their essays, we could use a few more men to have a little more cushion. Right now, we don't have as many female incarcerated addicts actively participating in the program, but this ebbs and flows and may be exactly the opposite in our next report. I believe we had a large percentage of females from pre release programs and they were let out early and /or had program changes due to Covid.

Thank you to our sponsors. Most of the new volunteers came from NA members within our current volunteer's networks or from the CRNA website. Willing Sponsors can reach out to our email or can also enter their info on WWW.CRNA.ORG . There is a two year clean time requirement, and you will need an orientation to our guidelines and be willing to follow them. How you take your sponsee through the steps is up to you, but we ask that you commit to using the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous. Please note that if you fill out the form on the website, you will not be put in the rotation until you've been through our phone orientation. If you haven't received your orientation packet within a week, please check your spam folder and/or send us an email. Thanks everyone for your service.

Sponsorship Behind the Walls

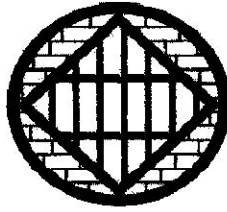

- Understanding of and willingness to follow the CR-SBTW guidelines
